



This is a 19% increase in clients since last Spring and summer can bring increased usage as well with the children out of school and needing "3 squares" at home. In addition to canned fruit, healthy snacks, Chef Boyardee, the Pantry needs to re-stock personal care items (toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, soap, shampoo and conditioner).
