Celebration Sunday: TODAY after the 10:15 am service we will have our Annual Celebration Sunday Picnic with hamburgers, hotdogs, an ice cream sundae bar!

Today is *Celebration Sunday* & there are lots of fun things for all to do including an opportunity to engage our amazing children in the knowledge and love of God. As part of our celebration, we will have a special activity for all children. Families, please do not drop your

children off before church. We are trying something new this Sunday. After the procession into the church, Fr. George will call the children and teachers to the front of the church. He will give them a blessing. The teachers will take the children out to the classroom for instruction. They will return to you at the sign of peace. This year's theme is "I am a vessel full of power, with a treasure from the Lord." We will have lots of fun initiating this theme, making Play Doh pots representing them and filling these pots with affirmative sticker messages representing God's love and care. We'll be melting mean-spirited rocks (baking soda) representing situations that confront us in our daily lives with bottles filled with faith, love, hope, peace, and kindness (vinegar)! Should be interesting! Hope your children can join us.

Our children and our families: On Sunday, September 21st, immediately following our 10:15 am service, Fr. George will facilitate a conversation on the future of St. James through the eyes of our children and families, and those who are not yet known to us. Many have noticed that we have wonderful children amongst us, elevating our life as a congregation. Some may also remember the old adage, "it takes a village to raise a child." Proverbs 22:6 says, "Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old, they will not turn from it." Sharing the faith that is in us with our children is one of the most important missions of St. James. Desiring to have more families and children should grow out of two things: the future of St. James AND the call God has placed on us to share the good news of Christ crucified with the world, children being no exception. We cannot, in the long term, hold onto sustainable growth without all of us praying faithfully about how we are all called to be a part of the process of reaching out to our youngest members here and out in the community. This includes our parents, our folks whose children are long since grown, and those who have no children but are part of the Body of Christ here, too. We have some to offer here: living water, life itself. Please plan to join us for an important presentation and conversation on September 21st, a conversation that joyfully concerns us all. This is not a heavy path but one full of promise, opportunity, and the love of Jesus.

Pastoral Care Ministry: On Saturday, September 27<sup>th</sup>, at 9:30 am, we will hold an informal gathering to discuss pastoral care ministry. Anyone who thinks they may be called to a ministry of presence, sitting with homebound folks, visiting people who are in continuing care or in the hospital, to provide companionship, are encouraged to come, listen to possibilities, and share ideas. No one will be asked to commit to anything, we will simply be starting a conversation. Coffee and light refreshments will be provided.

Lenten Devotional planned: Plans are in the works for preparing our own Lent 2026 devotional book. Who, what, when, etc.? Curious about this? Ask Dianne Antos how to get involved. On Sunday, September 28<sup>th</sup>, anyone interested in a Lenten writing/reflection project is invited to join us. We will hold a conversation between the services at 9 am and after the 10:15 am service, as well.

*I Am a Vessel of God's Power*: Friday, October 17<sup>th</sup> to Saturday, October 18<sup>th</sup> at Camp Washington, Lakeside, CT. We are very excited about the Women's Retreat being planned for this fall for the women of St. James Parish! We are so blessed to have as our retreat leader The Rev. Canon Susanna Cates Mother Susanna received her Master of Divinity from the Episcopal Seminary of the Southwest in 2013 and has served as an ordained priest in the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Northwest Texas, the Diocese of Newark, and now in the Diocese of New Jersey. Originally raised in the Jewish tradition, she rejoices in the diversity, openness to questions, and welcoming spirit of the Episcopal Church – and she loves to hear about everyone's faith journeys!

Our retreat is centered around *The Corinthian Song* and its Scriptural source, 2 Corinthians 4:1–15. We may sometimes feel as though the bodily "jars of clay" that house our spirits are fragile, cast down, battered, and full of confusion. But God has created us, fills us with God's own Holy Spirit, and calls us to empty ourselves through the work of discipleship and service—and as we are emptied, we are continually refilled and strengthened! Join us as we pray, honor our own ministries, find new paths of service, and celebrate God's joyful power in each one of us.

Our time together begins Friday evening at 6 pm as we arrive at Camp Washington for dinner and our evening program. We'll continue our workshops and prayers on Saturday morning, welcoming those who are joining us just for the day, and conclude by 4 pm Saturday afternoon.

The weekend includes all meals, materials and supplies, and lodging for those arriving on Friday. The cost for the weekend is \$150.50 for a single room or \$200 for a double. If you can only come on Saturday, you will miss some programming, but the cost is \$63. We do not want cost to prevent anyone from coming, so, if you need assistance, please check in with Fr. Hearing assist support upgrade: We had a recent upgrade to our sanctuary audio system which should clear up the volume issues some have experienced on the livestream and in the worship space itself. Please let us know if those issues are unresolved for you at home. There is a new Wi-Fi station, very discreetly placed, that should help folks with hearing impairments. We have, by way of reminder, four devices to help those who need them to better hear the service. They can be found on the table in the narthex (ask ushers for help, if needed). The process is simple and below, if you have an iPhone or Android, you can use your phone.

- + Get one of our hearing aid devices
- + Log into to St. James Par (our Wi-Fi network) with password StJofc2010
- + Go to the App Store and download Wavecast audio receiver (Williams).
- + Once you have the app, open it, and click on Search by channel or name
- + You can adjust the volume or the hearing aid device (each device comes with simple instructions).
