Throughout November Women's Ministry is providing art supplies in the parish hall for our parishioners to create bookmarks which will then be laminated and used in our pew books. Bring your imagination and creativity to make a useful tool for all who come to worship here!



Care packages for college students & military: Each year around December finals, we send our young people in college or serving in the military a small care package to let them know we are thinking about and praying for them. If you have a child or grandchild serving in the Armed

Forces or at college (even if they are living at home), please provide the parish office with their name and address by TOMORROW. We will take donations of granola bars, snacks, etc. to put in the care packages; please use the marked donation box in the parish hall. We also invite you to donate to our Youth Fund to support this and other ministries for our older children and young adults.

Advent Bible study: Join us on the four Sundays of Advent at 12:30 pm on Zoom, for a special Bible Study of Advent. We will use the theme of our Advent wreath candles – and their colors – to frame a special four-part Bible study. Beginning TODAY and the next three Sundays of Advent (December 7th, 14th, and 21st), we will explore Hope (purple, Advent 1), Peace (purple, candle 2), Joy (pink, candle 3), and Love (purple, candle 4). Each week will be framed by verses from scripture that foretell the coming of the Messiah, from the prophets, the psalms, and the Gospel witness

itself. Please plan to join us via Zoom, if you can!! Note that on December 21st the Study will begin at 1 p.m. due to our *Greening of the Church*. A wonderful way to connect to the themes of the Advent season, as we wait expectantly the coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

So, join us NEXT SUNDAY, December 7<sup>th</sup> from 9 am–9:45 am, bring your family and neighbors, and share in the

great food from our Men's Group. In addition, we will celebrate St. Nicholas Day! St. Nicholas was known for giving to the poor, caring for orphaned children, and defending the faith of Jesus as it had come down through the church. We will have a visit from St. Nicholas again, who will share stories with us and our children! We also invite, on this special day, folks to bring ornaments from home that you would like to donate to the church which we will put on our St. James Christmas Tree that very day (lightly used or new ones, please). So much to celebrate next Sunday!!

Advent Devotionals: Each Advent we have a small devotional to help us further connect with the importance and power of the Advent season. This year we are using *Our Dear Christ Enters In* by Jane Wilke. These devotions are in the pews this Sunday and are yours to take, pray with, and grow with for Advent, as we approach the Nativity of our Lord. Each devotion – representing each day of Advent - has a brief scripture verse, a short reflection, and a prayer.

# Outreach Corner

#### **Food Collection**

Thank you to everyone in our wonderful St James Community for your immediate and generous response to our food collection effort. The great need at these food pantries continues, so we will continue our collection. There are two bins in the narthex. The blue one is for the community food pantries and the darker bin is for St Mark's Pantry. There are some items that are most needed by all of the food pantries:

- · Canned proteins tuna, chicken, stews, beans, soup, chili, and other canned meats
- Canned fruit and vegetables
- · Low sodium foods
- · Pasta, sauces, Mac and cheese
- · Peanut butter and jelly
- · Cereal, crackers, oatmeal, snacks
- · Flour, sugar, mixes, condiments, coffee, tea
- Toilet paper, laundry detergent
- Personal items toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, deodorant etc.

## **Outreach Meeting**

Our yearend Outreach Meeting will be held Sunday, December 14<sup>th</sup> after the 10:15 am service. At this meeting we will review our outreach efforts this year to determine if they are still in line with our priorities and people's needs. This is a wonderful opportunity for St James to share joy with those in need in our community. **The deadline for gifts is NOON on MONDAY, December 15**<sup>th</sup>. Hearing assist support upgrade: We have an upgrade to our sanctuary audio system which should clear up volume issues some have experienced on the livestream and in the worship space itself. Please let us know if those issues are unresolved for you at home. There is a discreetly placed Wifi station that should help folks with hearing impairments. We have four devices which can be found on the table in the narthex (ask ushers for help, if needed). The process is simple and below; if you have an iPhone or Android, you can use your phone:

- + Get one of our hearing aid devices
- + Log into to St. James Par (our Wi-Fi network) with password StJofc2010
- + Go to the App Store and download Wavecast audio receiver (Williams).
- + Once you have the app, open it, and click on Search by channel or name
- + Adjust the volume on the hearing aid device (each device comes with simple instructions).
